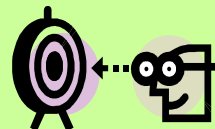

### Members,

The new shelter on the skeet range has been completed to include the final building permit inspection. A big well done and thank you to all the members who helped get this important project finished.

Up next is the construction of 4 to 5 picnic tables. This is a joint 4-H and ASC project. We are currently in the process of obtaining materials. The call will be made soon for a work party asking for help to build these tables. Please keep an eye on your e-mail.

**Safety Item.** I would like to ask all members to police their spent brass after shooting for the day (especially the small calibers which we all enjoy shooting). I'm concerned because I've received complaints of brass left on the cement range floor that has caused a "slipping" hazard. The club supplies brooms, scoop buckets, and buckets for brass if you do not reload your ammunition. **In an effort to be green,** I ask that we do not simply sweep the brass onto the dirt portion of the range. Let's get it up and recycle what we are not using.

Finally **on the green,** the Club will be installing plastic "garbage bags" in the range garbage cans. The idea is to make it easier to empty the containers and keep our range looking good. When you're done for the day, please place your shot-up targets in the garbage. If the can is full, please remove the bag and replace it with one from the bottom of the can, then dispose of the full bag in one of the 4-H dumpsters located opposite our conex box.
